No membership or entry fee in section S.
2. All articles competing in this department must be the work of the exhibitor, and not previously shown at Killarney Fair.
3. The Committee reserves the right to reject or accept conditionally all entries or applications at any time.
4. In the absence of competition in any section, or if the article exhibited is of inferior quality, the judges will award only such prizes as they think deserving.
THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.
5. No exhibitor is permitted to enter more than one article in any class.
6. The Directors will take every possible precaution to ensure the safety of all exhibits brought to the exhibition. They will give all assistance in their power towards the care and recovery of same, but will not make payment for the value thereof.
7. Previous to the fair phone Margaret Nichol (523-8678), Sirley Keyes (523-4526) for entry number.
Entry tags maybe picked up at Simply Sewing, 516 Broadway, Killarney, Only one exhibitor may list items on each entry form. Fees to be paid at time of entry.
8. Exhibits and entries will be accepted in the Homecraft Display Building the Thursday before the Fair, between **3.00 p.m.** and **4.30 p.m.** and **6 p.m.** and **9 p.m.**
9. Homecraft Building will be closed to the public at **6:00 p.m.** on Saturday, the day of the fair. Exhibits to be picked up at **6:30 p.m.** Directors will not be responsible for any article after **7:00 p.m.** check ad's in 2011 for any time changes, or additional classes. In the event of inclement weather and the fair is called off earlier, the building may close earlier at directors discretion and exhibits may be picked up earlier.
10. Prize money will be available at **6:00 p.m.** Saturday. Trophies and special awards available at time of exhibit pickup.
11. Any monetary corrections to entry forms will be adjusted at time of prize distribution.

Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies Provincial Quilt Competition

Rules and Regulations: (Subject to changes)

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors who have not won first prize in the Agricultural Societies' Provincial Competition in the past three years.
2. The judging criteria used for judging is included in the "Judging Standards" book.
3. Entry can be hand quilted or machine quilted. No commercial quilting will be allowed.
The entry must be quilted by the person submitting the quilt.
4. Quilts must have an appropriate title.
5. Quilts must be at least 152 cm x 178 cm (60" x 70") to be considered for the competition.
6. A Score Sheet will be distributed to all societies which must be used to judge the quilts.
Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the district or final competition.
7. Each society may select three quilts at their fair to participate in the district competition. Up to four quilts will be chosen at the district competition to go to the provincial competition, either machine or hand quilted.
8. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have one quilt advance to the provincial finals.
9. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many fairs as the exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the society where it was first entered in the provincial competition and won. The exhibitor must advise societies at the time of entry if the quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
10. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the provincial competition, the runner-up quilt will be selected to represent the society in the district competition.
11. At the end of the competition, the quilts will be returned to the quilters.
12. Pictures of the winning quilts and exhibitors are to be kept each year and placed in a traveling album.
13. At the district level prize monies of \$20.00 will be awarded for the two top quilts in each category.
At the finals \$1200.00 will be awarded in the hand quilting Category (1st Prize \$750 & 2nd Prize \$450) and \$800.00 in the machine quilting category (1st Prize \$500 & 2nd Prize \$300).
14. Pre-stamped and Cut Quilt kits are **not** allowed to enter, however "Block-of-the-Month" quilts are eligible for the competition.
15. Quilt is to be available for display at the M.A.A.S. conference until after Saturday night banquet – approximately 10:30 p.m.
16. Quilt owners are responsible for insuring their own quilts. The sponsors, societies, and MAAS will not be liable for damage or loss.
